



The Municipal Corporation of the Town of Fort Erie

By-law No. 36-2019

Being a By-law to Authorize the Entry into a Traffic Signal Agreement with The Regional Municipality of Niagara

Whereas The Corporation of the Town of Fort Erie and The Regional Municipality of Niagara entered into a Traffic Signal Agreement in 2005 for the maintenance of the traffic signals owned by the Town of Fort Erie, which has expired; and

Whereas there are traffic control signals on various municipal roadways within the Region, and under the jurisdiction of the Town of Fort Erie are identified in Schedule "A"; and

Whereas for the purpose of regulating traffic, it is deemed desirable to permit The Regional Municipality of Niagara, on behalf of, and at the expense of the Town of Fort Erie, to operate and maintain the Traffic Control Signals, Illumination and Flashers, owned by the Town of Fort Erie at the locations identified in Schedule "A".

Now therefore the Municipal Council of The Corporation of the Town of Fort Erie enacts as follows:

1. **That** the entry into a Traffic Signal Agreement with The Regional Municipality of Niagara for the operation and maintenance of the traffic signals owned by the Town of Fort Erie, is authorized and approved.
2. **That** the Mayor and Clerk are authorized and directed to execute the Agreement, in a form satisfactory to the Town Solicitor, and to affix the corporate seal thereto.
3. **That** the Clerk of the Town is authorized to effect any minor modifications, corrections or omissions, solely of an administrative, numerical, grammatical, semantical or descriptive nature to this by-law or its schedules after the passage of this by-law.

Read a first, second and third time and finally passed this 25th day of February, 2019.
