

The Fort Erie Historical Museum was started by the Bertie Historical Society in 1972.

Thousands of people have contributed to the collection, research files, events, exhibits, fundraising, and many community partnerships. To each of you, we say a grateful "Thank you!"

Each year the Museum is responsible for 40-60 projects, so for this celebratory page, we chose 1 or 2 projects to represent each year.

In 1987 the Museum became a Town of Fort Erie operation and the administrative "hub" for Ridgeway Battlefield Museum and the Fort Erie Railway Museum. In 2006 the operation included the Mewinzha gallery

and in 2009 the Mentholatum artifact facility. We included those milestones too for this celebratory page.

- 1972 Bertie Historical Society opened a museum on the first floor of the Bertie Township Hall building (key volunteers - Ruth Ellsworth, Bev Jewson, Jean Tripp, Pat Mitchell, Helen Sherk, and Margaret Teal)
- 1973 Education Week Open Houses featured Town granted permission to expand the Museum to the second floor Town appointed a Museum Board (first Chairman - Frank LeJeune)
- 1974 Bertie Town Hall book published Township Hall 100th anniversary exhibits and events produced
- **1975** Teal cabin acquired (stood during the Battle of Ridgeway)
- **1976** Teal cabin moved to Ridgeway Battlefield Park
- 1977 50th anniversary of the Peace Bridge exhibit installed Community Slide Collection project initiated
- 1978 Fort Erie Historical Society disbanded (some of their artifacts moved from Mather's Arch to the Historical Museum)
- 1979 Historical Journal magazine published Year of the Child and Canada Week events and exhibits produced
- **1980** Newspaper clipping reference files initiated
- 1981 Dr. Douglas display at the Hospital installed
- 1982 Brig. Gen. E.A. Cruikshank plaque installed Fort Erie's 125th anniversary research project completed
- 1983 Microfilm copies acquired of minutes from Bertie Township, Crystal Beach, and Fort Erie Councils (1850-1969) from the Ontario Archives
- 1984 Bicentennial of Ontario events and exhibits produced
- 1985 Woolever Photo Studio negative collection donated
- 1986 75th anniversary of the Bertie Historical Society celebrated
- **1987** First full-time Curator hired (Jane Davies) Board amalgamaed with Railway Museum (1st Chairman - Victor Miller)
- 1988 Bingo fundraising began to support the Museum
- 1989 Crystal Beach Park tape produced New galleries opened with new HVAC, security, and lighting
- 1990 Tales of the Old Town book published Memories of Crystal Beach Amusement Park exhibit featured
- **1991** Battle of Ridgeway re-enactment produced (13,000 people attended) Year of the Fenian book published Battle of Ridgeway driving tour launched
- 1992 Snapshots magazine published Bertie Hall plaque installed Museum's 20th and 6218 steam engine's 50th anniversaries celebrated
